
ORDINARY LIVES, EXTRAORDINARY TIMES: ITALIAN CANADIAN EXPERIENCES DURING WORLD WAR TWO

On June 10, 1940 Italy declared war against Great Britain and her allies. Canadian Prime Minister Mackenzie King designated an estimated 31, 000 Italian Canadians as "enemy aliens" and authorized the internment of about 600 individuals. The travelling exhibit Ordinary Lives, Extraordinary Times: Italian Canadian Experiences During World War Two explores how the lives of Italian Canadian men, women, and children dramatically changed in June 1940. It draws upon a rich collection of oral histories collected by the Columbus Centre, putting a human





face to this little known period in Canadian history.



CELEBRATE THE BICENTENNIAL

The War of 1812 was a nation defining event in Canada's history, and the events surrounding the Battle of Lundy's Lane, on June 25, 1814, were pivotal moments in the War. Uncover the stories that shaped our nation using the museum's unique collection and array of educational programmes.

■ NIAGARA FALLS HISTORY MUSEUM TOUR

Explore one of Canada's best 1812 collections in a space designed with audio-visual ambiances of war and hands-on activities in the Gale Family War of 1812 Gallery. Learn about the history of world famous Niagara Falls, its community, its people and their stories in the new Community Gallery. Return to experience rotating exhibits in the Ontario Power Generation Temporary Exhibition Gallery. Request a customized tour which reflects one or all of the galleries mentioned.

Length – **45 minutes**

Cost: **\$3**

■ BATTLEFIELD TOUR

Walk in the footsteps of an 1812 Soldier on the Lundy's Lane Battlefield located at Drummond Hill Cemetery. Explore such topics as the lay of the land as it was in 1814, the experience of soldiers and civilians, tactics used in the battle, and the aftermath and effects of the battle.

Length – **45 minutes**Cost: **\$3**

MUSEUM AND BATTLEFIELD TOUR

Combine the best of both worlds! Begin by touring the museum galleries focusing on the War of 1812, then travel to the location of the Battle of Lundy's Lane and explore the location of "the bloodiest battle of the War of 1812."

Length – **90 minutes**Cost: **\$4**



■ UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL

In small groups, students examine primary source materials and role play the experiences of real people (soldiers, officers, First Nations, medical personnel, 'homefront' settlers), events of the War of 1812 period and the Battle of Lundy's Lane. Using maps, illustrations and source materials, they produce a dramatic presentation of the War through the perspective of the individuals who experienced the events. Includes gallery tour.

Length – **120 minutes**Grades: **7, 12**Cost: **\$5**

GOING MEDIEVAL

Cost: **\$15**

Grades: 4

Travel back to the Middle Ages with Blackthorn
Productions. Students become lords and ladies as they
touch and try on medieval armour and clothing, learn
an authentic medieval dance, explore medicine and
the Black Death and ask their questions of costumed
characters. Students will travel to stations throughout the
museum to experience the medieval world first hand.
This programme requires a minimum student
registration, please book by April 1st 2013.

MUSEUM DETECTIVES

THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Students examine the nature of slavery in the 18th and 19th centuries, some of the symbols, music and secret messages used on the Underground Railroad, the personalities that were involved, and the nature of their heroism. With the Underground Railroad Game, teams of students 'become' characters trying to make it to Niagara on the Underground Railroad. Decisions have to be made; consequences of those decisions have to be abided. This is a game of wit and chance.
